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Introduction Welcome History & Vision of Victory Outreach for Kids

God has a plan and a purpose to demonstrate His love for the people all over the world throughout all time. The ministry of Victory Outreach represents a part of God's overall mission to the inner cities of the world. This curriculum presents the story of the founders of Victory Outreach who embraced God's mission of Christian values bringing hope to the hopeless.

This resource is intended to give Sunday School Teachers of Victory Outreach hands-on approach to help teach children how the History and Vision of Victory Outreach fits into the plan of God and in the kingdom of God. The story of Pastor Sonny and Sister Julie is presented in the Victory Outreach History and Vision curriculum, which contains a total of eight lessons.

The Common English Bible (**CEB**) is the primary Scripture resource for Victory Outreach History and Vision Curriculum. We recommend having a copy of the New CEB Deep Blue Kids Bible. The Book "*Treasures Out of Darkness*" written by Pastor Sonny and Julie Arguinzoni was released at the 1991 World Conference. "*Treasures Out of Darkness*" has been a source of inspiration throughout the years and is the required text for teachers to read along with this curriculum. The foundational principles that will be taught in this curriculum comes from the Word of God, and is inspired through the lives of Pastor Sonny's and Julie's Arguinzoni, their conversion and early experiences with David Wilkerson and Nicky Cruz through Teen Challenge.

Enclosed with this curriculum you will find a guide for teachers entitled Creative Teaching Methods. Let this section help aid you with a variety of teaching methods that will better reinforce and complement the intended goal of this curriculum. Our prayer is that you are able to impart into every child within every Victory Outreach Church the History and Vision of this great ministry and its dynamic founders!



Creative Teaching Methods

Teaching children can be the most creative and spontaneous experience you'll ever have. Some of us work in environments that are routine and predictable. This is not so with children, they won't stand for it! So, teacher, here are some of the many strategies that you can use with your children. Go beyond the material we are providing for you. Change it up if you want, and make it work for you. Use your imagination and teach so your children will never forget. These lessons we've given you are merely a springboard for the wonderful things YOU will do in your teaching setting. Above all else, have fun!

STORYTELLING

Learn and relearn the story. Practice telling the story out loud. Tell it over and over until your presentation becomes natural. Assume a natural position and be at eye level with your students. Maintain eye contact. Be enthusiastic. Make the story come alive. Change the tone of your voice to represent the different characters and change the pace and volume of your delivery. Enunciate and articulate clearly. Project your voice so all can hear. For variety use a pre-recording to tell the story or parts of it. Use video clips or large pictures to help the students understand the story better. Another effective method is to use hand puppets to tell the story. You may also challenge the class to act out parts of the story. Another strategy is to have a "guest speaker" come in and be interviewed by you and by the students. This character could be a Bible character or someone who would be able to give the Bible lesson a "first hand" report of what happened.

LEARNING CENTERS

The learning center is a place where students become involved in direct learning activities that reinforce the Bible lesson. Students rotate from one center to another according to a predetermined schedule such as rotating three groups of children through three centers for 20-minute segments. The class may meet together for music, storytelling, and worship. After these three components are done then move to learning centers for memory work, reinforcement sheets, research, playtime, snack-time, crafts, drama, writing, etc.



Discussion Methods

Panel: A panel is an informal discussion carried on by representatives of the group with the participants seated in front of the class. The value of this technique is that several viewpoints can be presented.

Buzz Groups: Small discussion groups of three to eight children discuss simultaneously various phases of a topic with group reports to follow.

Brainstorming: The purpose of brainstorming is to generate numerous responses to a question or problem and to create an accepting attitude that may encourage further participation. All responses to a question are listed on the board. Then the teacher and class go back over the list and remove those that may not be appropriate.

Agree-disagree: In this method students indicate their agreement or disagreement with a set of statements or questions that may have valid pro or con issues. The statements are purposely worded vaguely to provoke discussion. Students may indicate their opinions by raising their hands, standing to their feet, or moving to the "agree" or "disagree" side of the room.



Drama Methods:
These are methods to involve the entire class through theater. Below are some drama methods you can consider using.

Skits-Short presentations

Plays-Presentation with costumes and rehearsals

Pantomimes-Non speaking skits.

Tableaus-Living pictures

Demonstrations-Share "hand's on, how to do it."

Pastor Sonny's Story

Lesson Focus:

God can help us when we're in trouble.

Praise & Worship:

Song Selection Teacher's Choice

Teacher's Insight:

Read chapter 2,3,& 4 from Treasures Out Of Darkness, by Sonny and Julie Arguinzoni.

Bible Verse:

Luke 1:37

For nothing is impossible with God.



Main Lesson:

Note to teacher: Use Treasures Out Of Darkness, chapters 2,3,& 4 as your resource for instruction.

Pastor Sonny was in trouble as a young man in New York City (**See Photo 1A**) where he grew up. He was raised in a Christian home but decided one day he was not going to go to church anymore. When he was 12 years old he thought it was cooler to hang out with the boys his age who were doing bad things rather than go to church. He was drinking alcohol and using drugs with the other boys. He started stealing to have money to buy drugs and soon found himself in trouble with the police. He often would steal cars and one day stole a big blue car and then while driving he crashed it. (**See Photo 1B**). That day the police came to his house and took him to jail.

Pastor Sonny kept getting into lots of trouble. He needed to change. He needed a miracle. Pastor Sonny was getting tired of this kind of life, but he thought no one could help him. He thought he would stay like this all of his life until he died.

One time, the Judge sent him to a place, like a hospital, where they tried to help him quit using drugs, but when he got out, he went back to using the drugs again. He went home that day to let his parents know that he had gotten out of the hospital. When his father saw him, he was very sad and mad because Pastor Sonny still had not changed. When Pastor Sonny saw his mom, he saw something different. She was not mad or worried, she had been praying to God for her son. The Lord told her not to worry because one day Pastor Sonny was going to ask Jesus to come into his heart and he would be alright. In the meantime, Pastor Sonny went back with his friends. He then met a pastor named David Wilkerson. (**See Photo 1C**) Pastor David told him that Jesus loved him and wanted to change his life. Pastor Sonny heard what he had to say but he did not believe it. One day, his friend named Chino, who also had lived a life like Pastor Sonny came up to him and told him how God had come into his heart and how his life was different now! He told him he no longer wanted to do bad things and how happy he was. Pastor Sonny couldn't believe that Chino had really changed.

Attention Grabber:

Show the children a flag from your own country. Share with them that the flag reminds us of the history of our country. It reminds us of the story of how we were founded as a nation. Ask the children:

Q. Does anyone know anything about the history of their country or some of the famous people from the past?

Ask them to name a few historical figures from their nations.

Song:

Teacher's Choice



Chino invited him to go to the Teen Challenge Center where people were hearing about God's love and learning how God could help them. When Pastor Sonny got there, he met Nicky Cruz. Nicky was a gang member who everybody knew. Nicky was always fighting with the gangs and giving the police a lot of trouble. Nicky Cruz was changed and became a Christian. Nicky asked Pastor Sonny if he could pray for him. Pastor Sonny said yes. Nicky put his hands on his shoulders and began to pray for him. Pastor Sonny felt the power of God and asked Jesus into his heart. God did a miracle for him that day. He had tried to find help before but nothing worked. But the moment Pastor Sonny gave his life to Jesus; he did not want to do drugs anymore and wanted to live for God! What seemed impossible for Pastor Sonny was possible for Almighty God.

Today Pastor Sonny is a great man of God who has been the leader of our ministry for over 40 years. He is the man God used to start the ministry of Victory Outreach (**See Photo 1D**). Victory Outreach has helped people all over the world! If God could use a man named Sonny Arguinzoni....just think what God can do with your life?



Application:

Say to the children:

1Peter 1:2 "God the Father chose you because of what he knew beforehand."

Q.Do you know how special you are?

God has chosen you because He loves you. He also knows the wonderful plan He has for your life. Give the children a sheet of paper with an oval head drawing for them to "fill in the blanks." Ask them to draw a self-portrait adding hair, eyes, mouth, eyebrows, ears and clothing for a head portrait. Write on the bottom of the self-portrait **GOD CHOSE ME**.

GAME:

Do Ahead of Time

On a chalkboard write out a verse with a scripture reference. Make two exact large heart shaped forms. Display one on the chalkboard also. Cut the second heart shape into the number of puzzle pieces representing each word and the scripture reference.

Let's Start

Go over verse a few times with children. Then begin to erase one word at a time and draw a line or a place holder for each word removed. Show the children the heart shaped form you have prepared. Ask the children to raise their hands if they know one of the missing words. If they give the correct answer they place the puzzle pieces on the solid heart shape that is displayed. When the class completes the heart puzzle, tell them the heart represents how we must put the Word of God into our hearts.


Teacher's Insight

Attention Grabber:

Say to the children: Prayer is exciting! The thought that God, the Creator of the Universe, hears us when we speak to him and answers us when we pray is amazing! God loves it when he hears his children praise him in joy!

Q. Have you ever had a prayer answered?

Ask the children to come up with a list of prayer requests and praises. When the list is complete, lead the children in prayer for requests and praises. Mix up the order so that requests and praises alternate. Each time that answered prayer is mentioned; encourage the children to raise their arms in the air and to shout praises in celebration. You may prefer to practice this a few times before you begin the prayer so that everyone is on the same page with how to do it. Consider trying this each week when children come to class. It will certainly raise the excitement level to start their class time with prayer and roller coaster praise!

Song:

Step by Step

Main Lesson:

Do you remember last week's story about Pastor Sonny's life and how God changed him? His mother was a woman who prayed for him all the time and she believed that one day he would give his life to God. Many times moms and dads, grandmothers and grandfathers and many others who love us are praying for us. The Bible says that even Jesus in heaven is praying for us! Isn't that wonderful? **(See Photo 2A)**

Remember, prayer or talking to God is very powerful! God wants us to talk to Him. He cares for us and loves us very much. And when we have a need for something or we are sick, He wants us to ask Him to help us. Listen to this story about a little girl who prayed for God to help her. **(See Photo 2B)** Eight-year old Vera watched from her hospital bed as the nurses walked hurriedly around while she and a few other patients waited for the special hospital bus to escort them to the big circus. The nurses wanted to cheer up the sick children. Vera tried to be happy and smile but because of an illness called Guillain-Barre Syndrome or GBS she couldn't move her arms and legs, and was beginning to have trouble eating. After Vera returned from the circus, the doctors conducted many tests. Vera could do nothing. She was lonely, scared and sad. Her condition worsened. Vera could not swallow any food. She became so weak; she couldn't talk.

One day, her large family gathered around her bedside. People came to encourage her. Her little sister, Mary, came and sat on her bed. She held her hand, she touched her face, and with tears in her eyes she said,

"Vera, please come how now, I miss you!"

Through the closed curtains, Vera barely overheard the doctor tell her parents to prepare the family for she would not live long. Vera was a preacher's child who grew up in a Spanish speaking church. She had attended weekly church services since she was born! During her young childhood over the years, she watched her father pray for many people **(See Photo 2C)**. Vera remembered people who said God healed them. Images of church people, songs, prayer and her family ran through her mind. That night, when she was alone, Vera closed her eyes as she lay sick in her hospital bed and thought out her prayer to God:

“Dear God,” she said, inside her head, “will you heal me?”

“I don’t want to die, I want to live.”

“If you heal me, I will be a singer just for you. Thank you. Amen.”

Vera believed and fell asleep. Little by little Vera started to move and speak slowly. A few days later she told the nurse that she was hungry. The surprised nurse brought her some Jell-O. She ate food and her muscles were beginning to move again. The nurses gave her physical therapy, which means they helped her to exercise her arms and legs. Everyone rejoiced at Vera’s amazing recovery! Oh! And what about the faithfulness of God? Sure enough, Vera became a gospel artist singer for the Lord! She grew up to be a woman of influence and faith. Her beautiful life has been lived out as an adult from the faith of an eight-year old girl who prayed a desperate prayer. God heard and answered.

Application:

Prayer Time Activity: Candlelight Prayer- use one flameless candle

Psalms 46:10 “Be still and know that I am God”

Light a flameless candle. Dim the room (may play soft prayer music). Ask Children to find a quiet spot to sit by themselves to focus thoughts on God. Read Psalms 46:10 to the children and have them repeat it after you several times. Then ask children to pray silently for the things of their choosing. Each time they think of a request, they should pray about it silently, and then silently repeat the words from Psa. 46:10 before moving on to the next request. After the prayer time is finished, gather children and turn on the lights. Ask children:



Q. How did it feel to pray by themselves with the lights down and quiet music playing?

Ask how they felt about repeating to themselves the words from Psalms 46:10.

Q.Does it help to be quiet?

Remind them that God is listening and is in control of everything.

Craft:

The Pretzel Prayer Reminder

Use a big bag of mini pretzels and one of pretzel sticks, enough for snacks and crafts. You also need white glue, pencils, markers, or crayons for writing and one piece of construction paper for each child.

Have children write John 16:33 on top of construction paper.

John 16:33

“In this world you will have trouble but take heart! I have overcome the world.”

Show children a mini pretzel while discussing we will have troubles and worries in this life.

Explain that our troubles are like the pretzel; they can seem all knotted up and twisted so we don’t know how to straighten things out on our own.

Then show children a pretzel stick. Tell children that when we take our troubles to God in prayer, trusting him for guidance, He can help us to find ways to straighten out our knotted up situations. He can smooth out the confusing things for us. Give each child a mini pretzel and a mini pretzel stick. Ask them to hold their pretzels to pray about what it is that concerns them. When they are finished, have them glue, below the Bible verse, a few mini pretzels on one side of the paper and a few pretzel sticks on the other side. Read the verse with the children and review the significance of the mini pretzel and the pretzel stick.

After the children have completed the craft, hand out more pretzels to eat with some juice.

Game:

The Closer the Better

Material needed: "Popcorn"

What you will do

Divide the children equally and have them stand in two lines, facing each other, about 10 feet apart. Each child will need to be facing another child. The children will be tossing a piece of popcorn back & forth to the person across from them. Then signal kids to take steps closer until they are able to throw in each other's mouths. Explain that our relationship with God is similar to what we just did. The further away from each other, the harder it was to catch the popcorn, the farther away from God, the harder it is to have a relationship with God. The closer we are to God, the easier it will be to have a strong relationship with him.

Q. How do we get close to God?

We get closer to God by reading the Bible, praying and fasting.



Julie's Story

Lesson Focus:

Jesus Loves you.

Praise & Worship:

Song Selection Teacher's choice.

Teacher Insight:

Read chapter 1 from Treasures Out Of Darkness, by Sonny and Julie Arguinzoni.

Bible Verse:

John 3:16 (CEB)

God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him won't perish but will have eternal life."



Attention Grabber:

Take children for a nature walk; point out all the beautiful things God created. He created the mountains, sky, trees, and the birds. When you come back to class, ask the children

Q. What was your favorite part on the walk?

Share with the child how much God loves us and that's why he has blessed us with so much. He wants us to enjoy all his creations. Ask the children:

Q. What else has God given us?

Allow children to talk for a few minutes. Talk about family members and how much God loves them. Mention our theme scripture John 3:16. Ask children to express how much they love their family.

Song:

Oh How I love Jesus



MAIN LESSON:

I want to tell you a story about a young girl named Julie Rivera, She was born and raised in East Los Angeles (**See Photo 3A**). She came from a big family: 2 sisters, 3 brothers a mother and father. The Rivera's owned and ran a family grocery store,. Not like the grocery store we see today. This was a small family owned store. Julie loved the store, every morning she would get up early and get the store ready for her mom and dad. Julie learned to work hard as a young girl. Some morning's Julie's dad would go to do different jobs. He would paint houses as a side job.

On days like these Julie would get up extra early and make her dad a special lunch (**See Photo 3B**). She loved her father so much; to her he was the tallest most handsome man. Julie's father would take his whole family on fun vacations. Julie felt like her family was the best and she felt so special. Though Julie had 2 sisters and 3 brothers she felt she was her dad's favorite.

One evening as the Rivera family was getting ready to sit down to dinner. Julie's mom asked her to call her brother Gary to dinner. She kept knocking on the bathroom door, he wouldn't answer. She called her father over. Her dad broke down the door and found that her brother Gary had overdosed in the bathroom. The Rivera family didn't know what to do. Everyone was screaming and crying.

Julie had an aunt named Lecia who was a Christian so they called her and asked her to pray. Julie's family didn't know how to pray they had never been to church. Then they called the ambulance... What seemed like a once perfect family was no longer perfect. The Rivera family continued to have problems, Gary was still using drugs, and another brother was drinking alcohol. Julie's parents were not getting along, always arguing it finally led to her parents getting a divorce. This broke Julie's heart. She loved her family so much and her parents meant so much to her. Julie began to change she began to hang around friends that were not good for her. This is the time she got involved in gangs. She thought maybe gangs would be the answer to her lonely sad heart. Sometimes people fill their heart with other things to fill the emptiness and loneliness. That's what Julie began to do. Julie's neighbor began to witness to her and told her Jesus was the answer to her hurting family. She also had a cousin that kept inviting her to church.

One day Julie decided to go to church, (**See Photo 3C**) as she walked through the doors of the little church she sat in the back. Every word that the preacher spoke began to touch her broken and sad heart, Julie felt every word was for her. Then the preacher asked people to come down to the front so he could pray for them. That day Julie walked to the front and she invited Jesus into her heart. Julie's life and the lives of her family would never be the same...Julie's parents and her brother's and sister's gave their hearts to Jesus. The lord restored the whole family and began to heal their broken hearts. Her brother's stopped using drugs and alcohol, and her parents also got back together.

Julie was no longer sad and lonely. God filled the emptiness in her heart. She couldn't wait to tell others about Jesus, she would stand on street corners and tell others about God's love and what he did for her and her family. She wanted to learn all about God and study the bible so she decided to go to Bible School (**See Photo 3D**). This is where she met Pastor Sonny Arquinzoni who would later become her husband (**See Photo 3E**).



APPLICATION:

Q. How much does God really love you?

The answer is in the bible, John 3:16 His love for us was so great He sent His only Son to this earth to die on the cross for you and me. It doesn't matter who you are. God sees that we needed him just like Julie did.

Q. Do you need Jesus today?

Q. Do you want to experience God's love?

All you have to do is ask Jesus to forgive you of all the bad things you have done and ask him into your heart.

Teachers please lead children in the prayer of salvation.

Game:

The Price is Right (See *Game Worksheet Attachment pg. 64*)



CRAFT:

Cup of Life

Materials Needed:

Ice cream cone for each child

Medium box of raisins

Bag of small and large marshmallows

Colorful candies (M&Ms)

Bag of red licorice

Create a sample: Cup of Life

Fill cone as follows:

In the bottom, place the one large marshmallow

Next, add a level of small colorful candies

Next, add a level of small Marshmallows

Next, add a level of raisins

Top with red string licorice made into the shape of the heart

What you will say:

Your parents do this in the church service during what we call "communion"

One of the things they do during communion is drink from a small cup. This helps them remember how much Jesus loves them. Today we will fill a cup with goodies to help us remember just how much God loves us too.

1. Pretend this ice-cream cone is the "Cup of Life" that Jesus gave us.
2. The raisins help us remember the bad things we do to make God sad.
3. The red licorice that we can shape into a heart helps us remember how much Jesus loves us. He even died on the cross for us.
4. These marshmallows help us remember that Jesus forgives our sins, and he washed them away so we are as white as snow.
5. These colorful candies represent all the blessings Jesus gives us when we follow Him.

Lesson Focus:

This Little Light of Mine

Choice Teacher Insight:

Meditate on the verses found in Matthew 38:16-20. Lets the children know God wants Jesus into the entire world

Bible Verse:

Matthew 28:19

“Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and of the Holy Spirit.”



Main Lesson:

DVD Lesson- Featuring Julie Arguinzi

Application:

Review the giving plan with the children and challenge them to bring their offering on the next United We Can Sunday.

Craft:

Collect 1 16oz. coffee can for each child. Enlist the help of your congregation to gather these cans. Prepare construction paper bands that cover the surface of the can. Bring magazines and find pictures of people from other nations. Older children can cut and paste while younger children will paste on pre-cut images. Decorate with stickers, glitter, decals, etc. Make sure their “United We Can” banks are marked with their name. Direct the children to collect their United We Can offerings throughout the month. They can bring them to class on the designated Sunday or choose to bring only their offering. (See Lesson 4 Photos)

Attention Grabber:

Ask the children to sit on the floor in a circle. Play a game “hot potato”. While the music plays, children pass the potato quickly to one another without dropping it. When the music stops, the child who is holding the potato must enter the middle of the circle and wait until the next child “out” is chosen. Play a few rounds and then say to the children:

Q. Did you have fun passing the “hot potato” to your friends?

Read chapter 5-6 from Treasures Out Of Darkness, by Sonny and Julie Arguinzoni.

Bible Verse:

Hebrews 11:1 (CEB)

Faith is the reality of what we hope for, the proof of what we don't see



MAIN LESSON:

Q. You know what else is super cool about the founder's of Victory Outreach International, Pastor Sonny and Sister Julie Arguinzoni?

FAITH is where their story begins...

Before they were married, before they even knew each other, they accepted Jesus as their Lord and Savior. It was early in their walk with God that both of them would by faith, attend Bible school. For Pastor Sonny, (**See Photo 5A**) it was at a time when he felt stuck and wasn't quite sure if he would go forward in his walk with God. So by faith, he left New York and was sent by his spiritual fathers David Wilkerson and Nicky Cruz to Los Angeles to attend Bible school. Meanwhile in Los Angeles at the age of seventeen, Sister Julie felt the call of God. With a burning desire to learn more of the Word of God she decided by faith, to enroll in Bible school. Neither one of them went to Bible school expecting to fall in love with anyone but the Lord, but God had a plan all along.

After meeting at Bible school and as time went on, Sister Julie couldn't get Pastor Sonny off her mind. This bothered her and she needed to separate with the Lord and find out what was going on. She wanted God to take the thoughts of him out of her mind. After a couple of days of praying and fasting the Lord spoke to her. He spoke clearly and told her, "Sonny is going to be your husband!" So it was by faith, she told the Lord, "If this is your will for my life, I'm willing." Meanwhile, Pastor Sonny had a passion for souls, so he began an evangelism team (evangelism team picture) that would evangelize the streets and have street rallies (**See Photo 5B**). Well, Sister Julie had a passion for souls too, so she joined the team and became his secretary. They got a little closer and eventually Pastor Sonny asked her on a date. They dated once a month but never without having an hour of prayer before their date. They prayed because they didn't want to offend the Lord.

Attention Grabber:

Q. Who knows what Oxygen is?

Q. Does it smell?

Q. Can you taste it?


Q. What about see it?

Q. How important is Oxygen?

Ok, on the count of three, let's see how long you can hold your breath (while children are holding their breath remind them they can only hold their breath for a period of time before they'll need help to keep on breathing, this help is Oxygen and without it, we can't survive) After children are done experimenting, conclude by telling them, it is safe to say that even though you can't feel, see, hear or smell oxygen, we can't live without it. Like Oxygen, Faith is something we also can't live without. Faith is believing in what you don't see, it's just that cool!

Song:

Teacher's Choice



Still dating, they both graduated Bible school and Pastor Sonny went back home to New York. It was then he realized how much he had missed Julie and wanted to be with her always. He knew it was time to propose. He went back to Los Angeles, asked her father for her hand in marriage, proposed and a year later they were married (**See Photo 5C**) it was in those first years of marriage that the Lord spoke to Pastor Sonny after a time of feeling uneasy, not really knowing what God's plan for his life was. Have you ever been told to do something you just did not want to do? Guess what? That's exactly what happened to Pastor Sonny. God told him,
"I want you to open a church and I want to fill it with drug addicts and their families."
 He never wanted to be a Pastor, an Evangelist is what he wanted to be, but by faith, he must continue on the plan of God. Los Angeles would be the place it would all start, East Los Angeles to be exact.



APPLICATION:

In Exodus 14, Moses also had a task to follow God's plan by faith. After rescuing and leading God's people out of slavery, the last thing he thought would get in the way of the promise land was a sea. Here they are, feeling like they are trapped because the enemy is behind them and a body of water in front of them. God told him to lift up the rod, and stretch out his hand over the sea and divide it. Really? Divide it? How in the world is that possible? God was not joking. Moses, by faith, did exactly what God said and the sea divide and the Israelites walked through to safety. Imagine that! You too will have to walk by faith and follow God's plan for your life. Even when it doesn't make sense or you may feel like you can't do or be what God is asking of you. Nevertheless, follow him by faith. God will lead you the right way!

GAME:

Tag, You're It!

Project the bible verse and say, *"Let's repeat the verse together about faith."*

Have the children repeat today's verse. Choose one child to be it. Have the child begin by saying the first words of the bible verse. Then he or she must tag another child, who continues the verse by adding the next few words. The second child then tags another child, and so on. Allow the class to look at the verse during the first few rounds, then remove the verse and challenge them to recite the verse from memory.

CRAFT:

Plant a grass seed in a flowering pot. Once you put soil over the seed you won't see it anymore, you just have to believe that it is still there. As you keep following directions to care for the seed, it will grow and you'll finally be able to see what was there all along. Faith: the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.



Let's Tell Others About Jesus

Lesson Focus:

We can tell others about Jesus

Praise & Worship:

The B-I-B-L-E

Teacher Insight:

Get to know the Great Commission, Matthew 28:18-20 (CEB). Stir up the importance of Evangelism in the children's hearts.

Bible Verse:

Mark 16:15 (CEB)

He said to them, "Go into the whole world and proclaim the good news to every creature."



Attention Grabber:

Have the children gather in a circle, they may sit on chairs or on the floor.

Tell them you have a little treat for them and to wait to eat until you have finished passing out the entire snack. Pass out a full graham cracker to every other child. After you have finished handing out the crackers you say, "Oh my, I don't have enough for everyone!"

Q. What can we do so everyone gets some snack today?"

Let them come to the idea that they can break their crackers in half and share with a child who does not have any. That way all the children will end up with half a cracker. Then say, "When we share the good news of how Jesus died for us and forgave us of our sin, we are sharing the most important thing ever." We can't keep the good news all to ourselves, just like we couldn't keep the big graham cracker all to ourselves, either. Sharing the graham cracker with our neighbor makes us both happy and blessed. Sharing the good news about God's love with our friends and neighbors makes God happy.

Song:

The B-I-B-L-E

Main Lesson:

For this lesson the teacher can make a Wordless Book of her/his own. All that is needed is one colored construction paper for each page. (8 ½ x 11) The gold page can be made from a yellow sheet or use gold wrapping paper. Teacher's script may be glued on back of each colored paper. However, do not just read the script. Use the script only to help you to tell the story with passion and enthusiasm. Today I would like to tell you a wonderful story from this book. (Hold up the Bible) it's my favorite in the whole world! One thing that makes it so special is that it's a true story right from God's Word, the Bible.

Q. Do you see what's different about this book?

Instead of using words to tell the story, it uses colors.

That's why it's called the "Wordless Book." Now let's turn to the gold page!

"THE GOLD PAGE"

The story begins on the gold page. It reminds me of the street of gold in Heaven that the Bible talks about.

Q. Do you know who lives in heaven?

God does and he wants you to be in Heaven with Him some day.

Q. You usually like to be with people you love, don't you?

That's why God wants you to be with Him in Heaven--He loves you very much! In the Bible, He says, "I have loved you with a love that last forever" (Jeremiah 31:3 CEB).

That means that God loved you even before you were born! You could put your name in there and say, "God has loved, (insert your name), with an everlasting love." God wants you to be in Heaven someday with Him, but there is something that can keep you from being there - sin. Now let's go to the next page.....this is the dark page.



“THE DARK PAGE” (Black)

This page reminds me of the darkness of sin. Sin is the bad things that people do. It is anything that you do or say or think or even feel that is against God. It is things like lying, cheating, disobeying your parents fighting with brothers or sisters or not being kind to someone. The Bible says that everyone has sinned; it plainly says, *“All have sinned”* (Romans 3: 23 CEB). When the Bible says, *“all have sinned”*, that includes both you and me! Yes, you and I and everybody else in the whole world have sinned and have done wrong things. The Bible says you and I were born with the desire to do the wrong things.

Q. Your mother didn't have to teach you how to disobey, did she?

Neither did mine.

Q. You probably get punished for doing wrong things at home, don't you?

Those are the kinds of things God calls sin. God has punishment for sin. It is to be separated from Him forever in a place of punishment the Bible calls Hell. However God doesn't want that. Remember, He loves you and wants you to be in Heaven with Him someday. In fact He wants to be your Heavenly Father right now, but if I were to end the story right now it would seem like no one is going to heaven.

Everyone has sinned, but God made a way for the problem of sin to be taken care of--The red page tells about that.

“THE RED PAGE”

Jesus is God's perfect Son and He is God the Son. The Lord Jesus was the only person in all of history to ever live His entire life without sinning. You would think that everyone would love someone like that, and yet when He grew up; wicked men took the Lord Jesus and nailed Him to a wooden cross. This red page reminds me that they left Him there to bleed and die. When He died He was taking the punishment for something He didn't



even do. He was willingly taking the punishment for every sin that you and I and everyone in the world has ever done. The punishment was to die. And the Lord Jesus knew the only way that your sin could be forgiven would be if He would die for you. Jesus died for your sins. The Bible says: *“Almost everything is cleansed by blood, According to the Law's regulations, and there is no forgiveness without blood being shed”* (Hebrews 9:22CEB).

As He died, the Lord Jesus said, *“It is finished.”* Everything that needed to be done for your sins to be taken away had been done by Him on the cross. They buried His body. But three days later He proved that He could take away your sins and give you everlasting life by coming back to life! Without dying again, He returned to Heaven, where He is today. Jesus is God's Son who died for you, and because of this you can become His child right now! The clean page tells how.

“THE CLEAN PAGE” (White)

God loves you so much and wants to be your Heavenly Father and have you live with Him in Heaven someday, but your sin separates you from Him. That's why He sent His Son, the Lord Jesus to die on the cross for you. The Bible says that if you believe with all your heart that Jesus died for you and rose again and receive Him by inviting Him to come and take away your sins, He will make you a part of God's forever family – God will become your Heavenly Father right now, and someday you will share.

Q. Have you ever believed and received the Lord Jesus so you could become God's child?

I'm not talking about whether you attend church or have been baptized or if your parents are Christians. Those things are good, but they cannot take away everyone's sin. He wants you to believe and receive Him. If you believe that Jesus, God's Son died for your sins on the cross and rose again, and you would like to be saved pray this prayer with me.



Dear God, I know that I have sinned and done wrong against you. I believe that Jesus is God's Son and that He took the punishment for all my sins by dying on the cross. I believe He came back to life again. I receive you now as my only Savior from sin. Thank you for making me your child right now as you promised. God speaks to us in the Bible and says, "I will never leave you or forsake you." That means He promises to always be with us and to help us when we need His help. How about if you sin again? When you become God's child, He wants you to grow in knowing Him better each day. This will help you obey God and live for Him. The last page, the green page, tells you how.

"THE GREEN PAGE"

Green reminds me of things that grow. Like trees and grass and plants. When you become God's child, He wants you to get to know Him better – to grow in knowledge of Him. Sin can keep that from happening. That's why we must pray to God everyday. We need to ask Him to forgive us when we do wrong things. And He will forgive us because He loves us. We need to get to know God through reading His word, the Bible. We need to go to church and Sunday school so we can learn more about God. And we need to tell others about Jesus! In fact, you can start telling others right away about the decision you've made to ask Jesus into your heart and ask them if they'd like to invite Him into their hearts, also. Lead children in the Sinner's Prayer

Q. Now if I'm God's child, and you are God's child, do you know what that means?

We are part of the same family!

Application/Prayer:

Take out a globe or world map and challenge the children with the need to pray for and go and reach lost people everywhere. Sing "He's Got the Whole World in His Hands." End in prayer for a lost world.

Game:

Banana Pass Game

This messy, fast-paced game is ideal for older kids. Divide them into two equal groups; they will need to be barefoot. Ask them to lie on the grass or floor head to toe in two lines. When the whistle blows, the first person in the line puts the banana between his feet. Next, he passes the banana over his head to the next person's feet. This continues until the first person in the line has the banana. He stands and says, "Pass the Banana." The first team to get their banana to their leader is the winner. If a team member drops a banana, they have to start over. This game can become messy so have paper towels for clean up. Say, "Just like we passed the banana from one person to the next, we need to remember to pass on the good news of salvation to people God brings our way."

Craft:

Wordless Book, Gospel Tracts

Choose one or more ideas below: Have the children make their own wordless book. Make small books that are 4x5 inches or so fastened together with staples, hole punched with brads or string.

Challenge the children to tell the story of the Wordless Book to one another and practice how to present the good news to one another. Children may also create gospel "tracts" to hand out to their school friends or neighbors.

“Then the king will reply to them, ‘I assure you that when you have done it for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you have done it for me.’”



Main Lesson:

Q. How many like sleep over's?

How exciting would it be to have a dozen or more of your friends' over for a sleep over?

Q. What would you do at your sleep over?

Well, I'm going to tell you about a sleepover like no other. Whose house, Pastor Sonny and Sister Julie's!

Ever since they fell in love with God, our founders have been burdened for hurting people. Victory Outreach today is all over the world, we're an amazing movement, with an amazing cause to reach treasures out of darkness, and we have amazing churches, filled with amazing people. But it wasn't always like this.

Q. Guess where our ministry started?

Victory Outreach started in Pastor Sonny and Sister Julie's home. Yes, their home! (**See Photo 7E**). It was there they would bring in people who were lost without hope and couldn't stop using drugs. They began holding services in their living room, where they loved, prayed and cared for the people. Pastor Sonny and Sister Julie were happy to teach them about the Lord.

To build God's house, you have to build God's people. By building their faith you are able to build their self-worth. Many believed they were a nobody and couldn't see themselves living no other way but the self destructing lifestyle they were so use to living. Seeing the miracle in their own lives, Pastor Sonny and Sister Julie knew, if God could do it for them, he could do it for anyone! So they continued reaching out, brought more people home and kept preaching the gospel. The church was growing fast in their home, it grew to about 40-50 people when Pastor Sonny had seen a church that had a for rent sign on it. This would be the place that would become Victory Outreach's very first church building, Gless Street (**See Photo 7D**). Everybody pitched in with the much-needed repairs and in no time God's house was being built up (**See Lesson 7 Photos**).

Attention Grabber:

“X Marks the Spot”

Bring a large map of your city to class and have 3 children while blind folded take a marker and anywhere on the map mark an X. Remove the blind fold and now with the help of all the children, discuss the different ways they could get to the spots marked. As an extra challenge, list directions to one of the spots. Teacher, mention it's important to not only know where you're going but how you're going to get there! At times, we need others to help show us the way.

Song:

The Wise Man



There on Gless Street, Pastor Sonny continued building up God's people, even though his own family was in need. They had no support; barely any food, it was clothes from the donation box for them and their two little girls. Yet, somehow, God was still providing. This time it was a bigger home. Finally after 3yrs in their tiny 2-bedroom apartment, they took a step of faith and rented a three-story home. The bigger the home, the more people in the home. In no time, this home was filled with men and women who wanted to change their lives and stop using drugs.

Meanwhile the church was experiencing growth too. God began moving in a new way, Pastor Sonny would be preaching and all of a sudden the Holy Spirit would come upon him and he would begin to prophesy. *"God is going to raise up many of you. He's going to raise up pastors and evangelists, and missionaries, and He will send you all over the world. God will raise you up, as He raised up this ministry for that purpose."* The people would sit there looking at him with disbelief. Again and Again he would prophesy the same word *"And many of you, God is going to raise up, and you're going to be pastors and evangelists, and tremendous leaders all over the world."* Then, finally, one caught it! Gilbert told Pastor Sonny that he was going to be the first one sent out by Victory Outreach. Well and it was a baby church was birthed in Pico Rivera, California.

Even with the success came moments of discouragement. There were times when Pastor Sonny thought everything was going to fall apart. At a moment when he really needed God to speak to him, God did it again. It was at a conference, when Dick Mills (**See Photo 7A**) an evangelist who was speaking, told Pastor Sonny to stand, God had a word for him.

Isaiah 45:2-3

"I will go before you and make the crooked places straight; I will break in pieces the gates of bronze and cut the bars of iron. I will give you the treasures of darkness and hidden riches of secret places, that you may know that I, the Lord, who call you by named, am the God of Israel."

God gave Pastor Sonny a special delivery that day, one of Victory Outreach's promise scriptures. It was only the beginning.

Application:

Matthew 25:35-40, it is here where we find our memory verse. Jesus was sharing with the disciples what is going to happen when the Son of God comes in his glory. In these scriptures he points out the reward for taking care of others and the consequence of not taking care of others.

Q. Did you know that feeding, clothing, giving shelter, visiting people in need is like taking care of Jesus himself?

This pleases God that we like Pastor Sonny and Sister Julie think of others before our self.

Sadly, everywhere we go, we see people who are hurting. Like the person holding the sign on the corner, the lady begging for change in front of the store, your friend whose parents are getting a divorce.

Q. What about your family member who drinks a lot?

Q. How about the kids at school who live in a foster home?

We can never lose the compassion for people. You can make a difference, get out there and be the change you want to see in this world. Pray for people, invite one of your classmates or teammates to church. Love God, Love People!

Pyramid Scheme



Allow time for discussion. Ask students:


Q. What gifts does God give to us?

Main Lesson:

Introduce the words time, talent and treasure. Explain that God gives everyone, time, talent and treasure. Talents are things you are good at doing. Allow time for the children to share things they are good at. God gives everyone time to live (**See Lesson 8 Photos**).

Q. How can you spend your time helping others?

God gives people treasure. Treasures are things that you own, and also your money.

Q. What are some of your treasures?

We can use our time, talents and treasure in taking care of God's house and God's people. This makes God very happy. God has given us so many gifts. Today we will be talking about two of those special gifts, our church and people. These are two gifts that God wants us to take care of. How can we take care of our church and people we know and those we do not know.

In Luke 10:30-35(CEB), Jesus told a story about a man who helped someone he did not know.

Luke 10:30-35 Jesus replied, "A man went down from Jerusalem to Jericho. He encountered thieves, who stripped him naked, beat him up, and left him near death. Now it just so happened that a priest was also going down the same road. When he saw the injured man, he crossed over to the other side of the road and went on his way. Likewise, a Levite came by that spot, saw the injured man, and crossed over to the other side of the road and went on his way. A Samaritan, who was on a journey, came to where the man was. But when he saw him, he was moved with compassion. The Samaritan went to him and bandaged his wounds, tending them with oil and wine. Then he placed the wounded man on his own donkey, took him to an inn, and took care of him. The next day, he took two full days' worth of wages and gave them to the innkeeper. He said, 'Take care of him, and when I return, I will pay you back for any additional costs.' What an awesome story. After Jesus told the story, he asked, "Which one of the three men did the right thing?"

Q. What do you think is the answer and why?

It's important to take care of those we know and those we do not know. There are so many ways to do this. For instance, share you bible with the new kid at church, encourage your friend when he isn't having a good day. At home, helping around the house is a huge help.

Q. What are some other ways you can help out those you know and people you do not know?

Hey kids, something else we can take care of is our church? It's horrible when people write on the walls, leave trash everywhere, and even break things. Your church is God's house; shouldn't we take care of it? It so much fun to have a place to worship with friends, to learn more about God and to use the gifts God has given you to help take care of the church. Take good care of your church.

If we want more people to come to our church, more kids to join our class and our church to grow, we have to be faithful in the little, so that we can be faithful in much.

Application:

Luke 16:10 our memory scripture reminds us how important it is to be a good steward of all that God has given us and if we want more of what God has, we have to be faithful in the little.

You are a steward - a person who cares for everything that God has given to you.

Be a good steward with:

1. Your TIME (James 4:14)-life God has given you.
2. Your TREASURE (Luke 21:1-4) - things that we have, clothes, toys, money, books, etc.
3. Your TALENT- things that a person is good at doing.

Use your time, treasure and talent to take care of God's house and God's people.

Game:

Thumbs Up, Thumbs Down

Prepare a group of sentences to read. Some of them will show love, others will not. If the sentence describes a loving, caring action, students give the “thumbs up” signal, and if the sentence describes an unloving, uncaring action, students give the “thumbs down” signal.

Here are a few example sentences to read:

1. Sam made friends with the new kid in class.
2. Patty is sharing the handball at playtime.
3. Sean teased Marissa and now she is crying.
4. Makayla put gum under her desk.
5. Mia didn't listen to the teacher when she asked everyone to clean up.
6. Kenny brought his friend to church today.

Class Activity:

Take the class for a walk around the church; have them pick up any trash they might find. Even stop in the restrooms and straighten up. Encourage them to do things like this on their own, not just as a class. The idea is to have them participate in taking care of their church and classrooms.

Craft:

Teacher brings some blank greeting cards for the children to decorate. Ask the children to think of another child who doesn't come to class anymore or a child they would like to see come to class. As a way of taking care of God's people, with the help of the teacher or parent, deliver these cards by mail or in person. Take a moment in class to pray for those children who will be getting a card that they will be at church soon.

Lesson 3: Price Is Right Game

Instructions

Place all of the items in a row with the bible and cross or picture of heaven at the end as shown in the following example:

This game can be played individually or in a team of 2, Give each child a sheet of paper to guess and write down the price of each item. Point to one item at a time starting with the first one and have the children decide if the price shown is higher or lower than the actual price. Have them write what they think the price is, either higher or lower. Once they have made their choice display the actual price and repeat for each item. (Be creative with this game, pretending to be an actual game show host).

When you get down to the Bible, stop and see how the children are doing with their guesses of each price. Ask how many each team or individual guessed correctly. Then turn over the Bible price. Explain that even a Bible has a price, and can be bought.

Last, have them guess if the actual price for Heaven is higher or lower than \$10,000. (*This part is important*). Let the children guess and then turn the index card over. Explain that Heaven is the real thing and it is absolutely free. No amount of money can buy Heaven.

Optional: Give a special treat to anyone who got it right.

Children are to guess the price of several items, one of the items listed as Heaven, in order to discover the real price for Heaven and Salvation.


